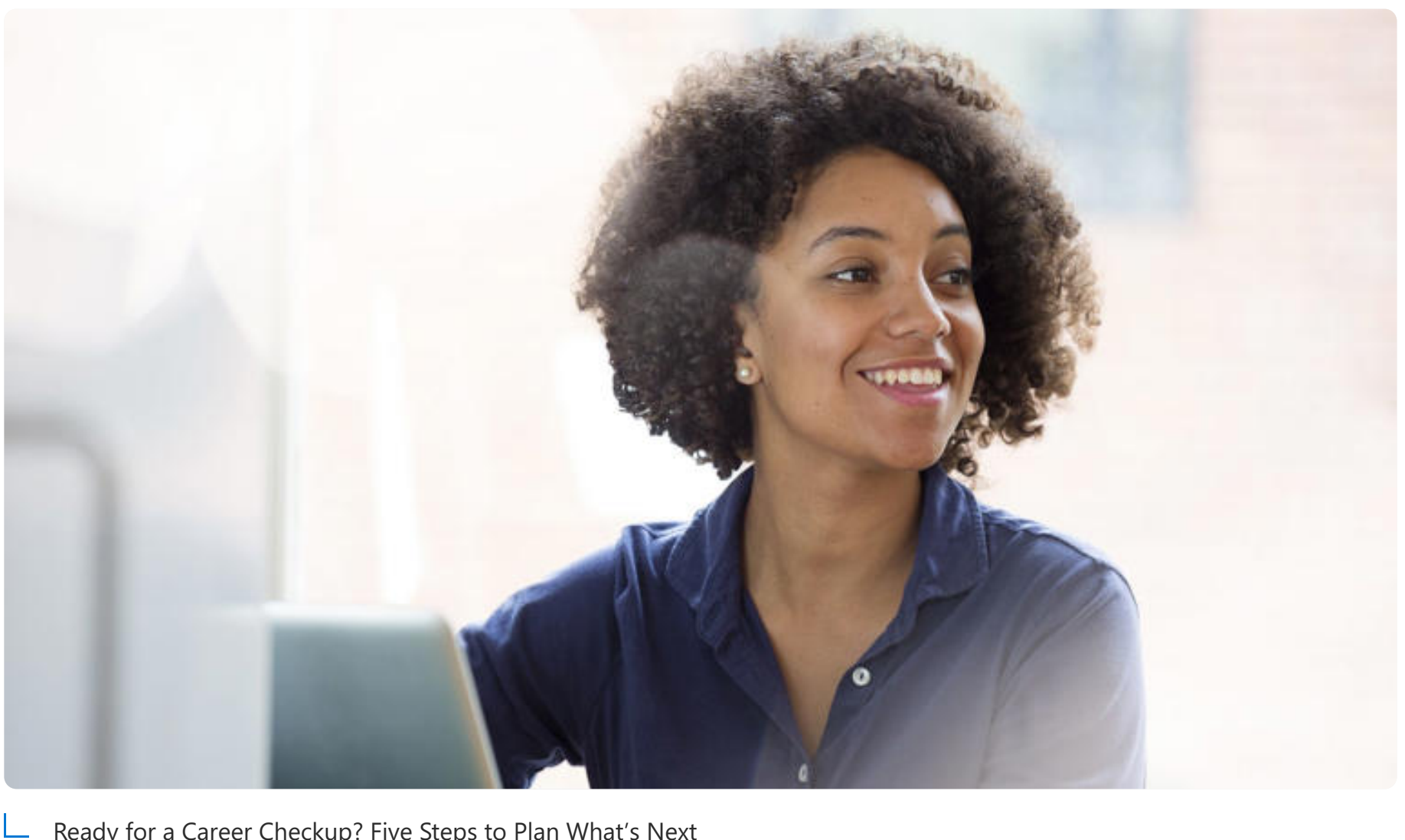

The union said that from May 8 members will not comply with the instruction Work from home civil servants are refusing to comply with an instruction to come back to the office for just two days a week, it has been announced.

More than 1,000 members of the Public and Commercial Services union (PCS) say they will not be 'forced back' to the office 40% of the week.

Employees at the Office for National Statistics (ONS), based in Newport, South Wales, Titchfield in Hampshire, London, Darlington, Manchester and Edinburgh, have already voted in favour of strikes and other forms of industrial action in protest at the drive for more office-based working.

The union said that, from May 8, their members will not comply with the instruction to work in the office for around two days a week.
